Green Cart Collection Moving to Weekly Schedule

- Starting the week of April 24, 2022, green cart collection will return to its weekly pickup schedule. Green carts are picked up weekly from April to October.
- This seasonal adjustment ensures efficient collection of food and yard waste during the warmer months, when we see an increase in volume of yard waste.
- There's no need to worry about changes to pick up days, or to the blue or black cart frequencies.
- Residents can visit calgary.ca/collection or download the Calgary Garbage Day app to check their schedule and sign up for free reminders.

Compost Giveaway

- The Compost Giveaway program provides an opportunity for Calgary residents to pick up complimentary compost and use it in their gardens and yards.
- The program uses an appointment-based system to ensure a safe and efficient process for residents, with appointments available for booking on **April 10th, 2023**.
- Compost can be picked up at the Shepard and Spyhill Landfills only by appointment from April 24th to June 10th, 2023.
- The Compost Giveaway program is a self-serve event, and residents must bring their own shovels and containers to pick up their compost.
- Each household is limited to 100L of compost, and only Calgary residents are eligible to participate in the program.
- In the event of extreme weather conditions, landfills may close unexpectedly, and appointments may be cancelled. Residents are encouraged to check the website for updates and reschedule their appointments if necessary.

- Residents who don't have computer access or who need assistance with booking can call 311.

Green Cart compost giveaway (calgary.ca)

Seasonal Yard Waste

- Residents can bring yard waste to a City landfill for free from Friday, April 14, 2023 to Sunday, May 28, 2023.
- This is useful for residential households that would like to dispose of extra material quickly or for yard waste that is too large for the green cart:
 - Loads should only have leaves, branches, plants and grass clippings.
 - We do not accept sod or food scraps. Put these items in your green cart.
 - Shake the soil off plants and roots.
 - o Any loads containing garbage or sod will be subject to regular landfill fees.
 - o Composting for sod is not available at City landfills. If you take sod to the landfill, you will be charged the basic sanitary rate.
 - o Commercial customers with yard waste will be subject to regular landfill fees.
 - Commercial loads are not accepted at Shepard.
- Preferred payment methods are credit card (Visa, Mastercard and American Express), debit card or cash.
- For faster service, we suggest visiting the landfill on a weekday, or before 9 a.m. on Saturdays when wait times are shorter.
- For hours and locations, visit <u>Landfill Locations and Hours</u>.

Safety Reminders For Kids

There have been incidents of a stranger approaching children in our community. This is a gentle reminder to have a discussion with your children on how to stay safe.

- 1. Walk with others and use the buddy system. There is greater security in numbers.
- 2. Stay at an arm's reach or more away from strangers.
- 3. If someone is following you on foot or in a car, go to a place where other people are present. Do not try to hide.
- 4. If someone in a car should stop and ask for help or directions, do not go near the car.
- 5. No one should ask you to look for a lost item. If a stranger asks you to help them look for something, run to a safe place.

- 6. Never go anywhere with someone you do not know (neither in a car, nor on foot).
- 7. Never take anything from strangers.
- 8. Inform your parents or another trusted adult about any encounter with a stranger as soon as possible.

City Council

Bylaw Ensures Safe and Inclusive Access to City Facilities

A good City is a caring City. A great City is also a compassionate and safe City. To succeed as a City, we need to have all members of the community participating. Everybody, including 2SLGBTQIA+, has legislated fundamental Human Rights, as well as the freedom to flourish. This now includes safe access to public events, by way of the Bylaw recently passed by Council in response to protests against such access. Safe access is now ensured, while the right to protest is still preserved, albeit at a prescribed distance. This new Bylaw will save significant City and Police resources which are currently being consumed by the protests.

From an economic perspective, the City of Calgary is in an international war for talent — competing with as many as 1,000 jurisdictions for skills. Our future prosperity depends on winning this battle. The people we seek to help us reach our potential share our values. I have worked with two of the largest investment funds in the world, who confirm that how we treat everybody is high on their list of criteria for investment. They recognize the double win — a robust business case coupled with a caring community of people supporting a diverse quality of life.

I believe we need to show leadership in safeguarding the rights and wellbeing of all our citizens at any events they choose to hold or attend. I support this new bylaw because I believe it does "strike a balance between respecting the right to protest, and The City providing safe and inclusive access to public services".
